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INFANTILE SCOLIOSIS OUTREACH PROGRAM

CAST CARE:

- 1. If cast gets wet, dry it completely with hairdryer (on cool) or fan.
- 2. The surface of the cast can be wiped clean with a damp cloth. (Soap & water.)
- 3. If edges of plaster cast are rough, moleskin should be used. Your doctor can provide this.
- 4. Avoid dropping small items into cast such as coins, food crumbs, etc. Never stick anything under cast such as coat hangers, or anything similar.

SKIN CARE:

- 1. Give your child a daily sponge bath. Be careful Not to get cast wet.
- 2. Once a day check skin around edges of cast for irritation or reddened areas. Place moleskin to pad and protect edges where skin is affected.
- 3. If itching is severe, contact your doctor. <u>Never</u> put anything in cast to scratch itchy areas.

SHAMPOOING HAIR:

- 1. Cover top of cast with plastic bag to prevent the cast from getting wet.
- 2. Have child lie on his or her back on drain board of sink. A rolled up towel for under child's neck may make it more comfortable.
- 3. Make sure water flow is going away from cast. A handheld Nozzle will make this easier.



BRACE CARE:

- 1. Wear a wrinkle free cotton t-shirt under brace
- 2. Check skin for pressure areas daily. (Redness.)
- 3. Redness should disappear 20 minutes after brace is removed. If not contact your orthotist.
- 4. Avoid use of lotions & creams that tend to soften skin.
- 5. Brace can be cleaned with a damp cloth with soap or rubbing alcohol. Make sure brace is completely dry before reapplying.

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
