It really settled in this year - we are now Ability Connection Colorado. Still fiercely proud to be formerly CP of Colorado, this organization has pioneered inclusive education, pathways to employment and grassroots family support statewide since 1946. And our new name continues to carry the legacy of our founding mothers forward.

2013-2014: a year of innovation

Delivering current, evidence-based programs is the key to nurturing human potential. The groundwork and preparations to open the second inclusive campus of public charter school Vanguard Classical East (September 2014) was laid. The capital campaign to finance the operations and renovations was a great success.

ACCO's Family Support Programs incubate vital community resources that grow out of parent-driven momentum and identify unique needs that are often systemically overlooked. This year brought a new family support program to do just that: the JP Prescription Drug Awareness Foundation is tackling the Colorado epidemic of prescription drug misuse. In seeking new avenues to meet people and families where they are, we collaborated with Circle K to provide iPads and technology to change children's daily lives.

2013-2014: a year of inclusion

At ACCO, inclusion is a platform for mutual understanding, collaboration and respect that benefits people of all abilities, and throughout this organization, inclusion is an active mindset, not an abstract concept. It is the foundation for individual growth, vibrant communities and real learning.

The team at the Kelly Smith Employment Center continued to expand the career landscapes for youth with disabilities this year. They continue to identify strong partners in the community that mentor and value the contributions of a motivated and enthusiastic workforce.

2013-2014: a year devoted to individual needs

EMPLOYMENT WORKS

Employment Works' mission is to connect youth and adults who have disabilities and other challenges to authentic employment opportunities, as well as, to develop the skills and assist in providing the resources necessary to thrive in the workplace.

- 1,974 People received intensive case management support
- •2,010 additional people received information, referral services and direct support



Ticket to Work/Fee for Service Job Development/Job Placement Program

- 85 People were reached by the program
- 55 Referrals became active program participants
- 38 Obtained employment (including participants with summer youth program)
- 17 Are in active job search status
- 35 Retained employment for 90 days or longer (Includes those who began a job within 90 days of the beginning of the year)



Ready to Achieve Mentoring Program RAMP

71 Youth were enrolled in the RAMP program
100% of youth completed Individualized Mentoring Plans
90% of youth have completed the program and successfully transitioned to the next grade or will be attending college in the fall



INFANTILE SCOLIOSIS OUTREACH PROGRAM

- 1,110 Children are currently being treated with Dr. Mehta's Early Treatment Method
- 3,150 Families were directly informed or advised about the treatment
- 600 Professionals were directly informed or advised about the nonsurgical treatment



JP PRESCRIPTION DRUG AWARENESS FOUNDATION

- Joined Statewide Services division in March, 2014
- Aims to stem the epidemic of accidental prescription drug overdose, which kills one person every 15 minutes in the USA



PARENT TO PARENT OF COLORADO

- 3,028 Members on database (11% increase from last year)
- 4,468 Individuals were provided information & Referral services
- 4,474 Attendees received P2P information at presentations during meetings and conferences
- 1,103 "Likes" on Facebook (40% increase from July 2013)
