### Creating a Brighter Future for Colorado Children

Western Summit Constructors, Inc. has been working with Creative Options for Early Childhood Education for the last ten years. Judy Ham presented Western Summit with an award for their ongoing contributions, including employee giving, in-kind donations, and its "Adopt a Family Program" for the holidays. Western Summit even built a ramp for the Jamaica site, thus enabling children of all abilities to access the facilities. This year, the Jamaica Early Childhood Education Center now serves a total of 130 Aurora families, and is one of four Creative Options education sites.

Thanks to our valued partners, Ability Connection Colorado will break ground on the 5th early childhood education site located in the Fitzsimmons redevelopment area. This center will serve one of the most economically distressed metro communities in Colorado. Naming opportunities will be available in early 2016.

## Letter from Judy Ham, CEO/President

Thank you. It's a word we do not use often enough to express gratitude for the support you provide to Ability Connection Colorado.

For 70 years, we have been focused on providing innovative and exceptional services to reach as many individuals and families as we can, helping to educate, employ, and support those with developmental and intellectual disabilities. As we enter the season of gratitude, I am reminded – and thankful – that each of you helps ensure we can meet this mission.

Recently, I was looking through a notebook entitled "Twenty Years of Achievement – 1946 to 1965," created by a volunteer many years ago. Included in this physical history is the first recorded donation in 1947 from the Kiwanis Club of Denver in the amount of \$750.00 to establish a loan library to "aid parents in their search for more knowledge concerning Cerebral Palsy." The pages are typed and yellowing, but the message and the memories are clear. It was a true grassroots community of volunteers, families, and donors, who built what is now Ability Connection Colorado – and this legacy continues today. In fact, just recently the Kiwanis Club donated a gift to Ability Connection Colorado.

This year's successes and achievements remind me of how we have remained true to the vision of the nine women who met in 1946 to form a Mother's Club. They "dared to dream of a better life for their disabled children." Over the past 70 years, we have worked to carry on this founding vision. As an organization, we have matured and now impact tens of thousands of lives each year to realize our vision to: "live in a community that includes, accepts, and celebrates all abilities and contributions through our innovative and comprehensive programs."



## Creating Pathways to Employment



Recognizing Colorado's need to end the cycle of poverty particularly for Colorado's most vulnerable, at-risk populations and those with disabilities, Ability Connection Colorado will expand its employment services in 2016. We currently serve teens and adults, but so many more are in need of our services. Thanks to the generous support of Wine in the Pines patrons, we were able to open 376 new cases, and 373 already have jobs.

The Department of Labor and the Social Security Administration recently recognized one of Ability Connection Colorado's employment clients highlighting skills development and employment training.

I am humbled by the support of partners like you throughout Colorado. One of our newest 2015 partners, Kaiser Permanente, gifted \$10,000 for Wine in the Pines, which is our signature gala benefiting the Employment Works program. Some of our community partners have been with us for many, many years such as the Bill Barrett Corporation, 1st Bank, TCBY, Enercom, and of course, our Platinum Sponsor, Circle K. While these are just a few of our supporters, all those who give so generously – from \$25 per month to \$25,000 per year – have helped us reach more than 40,000 Coloradans.

I hope these stories inspire you, as they have me for more than 20 years. It has been an honor and a privilege to work with families, individuals, and our incredibly generous and supportive sponsors and community partners.

Rest assured that as stewards of your generous support, ACCO ensures .89 cents of every dollar directly funds programs. Every dollar matters and helps us serve more than 40,000 Coloradans each year. We have an annual wait list of approximately 850 Coloradans in need, which tells me that the services we provide are of quality and essential – and there is more to do.

On behalf of the board of directors and the entire organization, thank you for your partnership and support over the past year. Together, we have accomplished so much.
